# PASTOR'S MESSAGE: SEASON OF LENT

We are still journeying through Lent, and it may resemble long passages of life where it seems like God is not accompanying us along the way. We wrestle with questions of "God where are you?" or "Why me Lord, what wrongs have I done?"

A reminder during this month is that Lent is a season of penitence, where we walk towards righteousness, and affirm our relationship with God. In Psalm 51:1, we read, "Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy, blot out my transgressions." These words from David are asking in a prayerful way for cleansing and pardon after the conversation of prophet Nathan, who came to him concerning Bathsheba. The Psalm of David is a reminder of the many shortcomings of righteousness we may have in front of God, and how sin by action and inaction make us fall short of righteousness.

Therefore, our journey still should be of deep reflection, a personal assessment of our shortcomings, and a humble and honest desire to be made whole so we have a clean heart before God come Easter morning. This gives an authentic reason in sharing David's prayerful request of, "Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me (vs. 10)," as though we, too, are resurrecting with Christ to be complete and made righteous.

So, our wrestling is to fulfill an appeal, like the one of David: "[God] You desire truth in the inward being; therefore, teach me wisdom in my secret heart. Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean; wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow (vs.6,7)." Let's face the facts: desiring truth is not as easy as some make it seem. Truth is, in most cases, dangerous: and we would rather it not surface. But it does lead towards wisdom as it sinks deep into our hearts: and, at the right times, surfaces to maintain our righteousness. The purge comes, maybe not with hyssop, but through the faith and wisdom gained. The removal of shortcomings and the continuation of cleanliness comes from Scripture reading, prayer, fasting, alms, and true fellowship with God.

Then on Easter morning, we shall sing and praise God for our own resurrection.

Prayerfully consider your contribution to the monthly special offering.



#### TRUSTEES FOCUS ON MORE PROJECTS

The Board of Trustees met February 6. Many items were discussed. The new vacuums have been delivered. The cross and flame should be painted and ready for installation in April or May.

The list of signers for the Trustees' savings account has been updated. The Administrative Council approved the list on February 21.

The status of the parsonage inspection was reported. The correction of noted deficiencies is underway. CLT has been contracted to replace the carpet in the basement with ceramic tile. Area rugs will be provided instead of carpeting.

Progress on the classroom renovations was discussed. The firewall has been constructed, and work is underway to paint and replace the flooring in the other room.

The office copier lease is being renewed at a lower monthly rate; a new machine will be provided. Deb Mills, Carl Sundstrom and Audrey Knight discussed the needs of the church with the Marco representative and removed some features of the previous contract which have not been used. The cost per copy will remain the same.

The Trustees voted to pay for the new furnace and plumbing repairs in the men's room in the basement. Summit Plumbing and Heating has been contracted to replace missing ductwork below the stage, to replumb the upstairs restrooms to make hot water available in them, and to install a new faucet on the outside of the church to allow the removal of the hydrant by the main entry, which will facilitate remodeling the women's restroom downstairs.

The Trustees are reopening the project to light the cross and are seeking a bid from a sign company that specializes in that work.

The Trustees next meeting will be March 5.
