NEW YEAR'S MESSAGE

Like many people, you may be looking for a fresh start, resulting in making resolutions for a more positive lifestyle. Reviewing some mistakes and old habits needing to be broken would lead to a healthier life. Resolutions or the idea of a fresh start seem to be on the minds of so many people every New Year. But, in the past most resolutions did not stick and eating seemed to be the only resolve for comfort. And yep, there goes that resolution. It wasn't even a month!

What then have we gained, or what should we claim as a fresh start? Here is a verse that I have always reviewed every New Year, a verse that does not require any resolutions but faith alone:

NEW ADULT SUNDAY SCHOOL STUDY

Adult Sunday School participants will engage in a six-week study using the book, *Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith*, by Adam Hamilton.

TRUSTEES MAKE IMPROVEMENTS

Trustees have now received a renewed insurance policy covering all the Conference requirements except wind and hail. Our Church Mutual representative continues to shop for coverage for these perils but has found only prohibitively expensive alternatives so far. She expects additional bids in January. We have also reached out to local insurers and are working with one of them, but so far have not found any who can offer us this coverage. A number of minor repairs were scheduled at our December 5 meeting. We learned that one of the furnaces in the church basement had failed. A new furnace has been purchased and installed.

Other work includes repairing the stucco where the abandoned duct work from the old swamp cooler was removed, various plumbing repairs in the church basement, and drainage improvements at the church. The RO system at the parsonage is being replaced as well.

We will be inspecting the recently vacated classrooms in the basement to determine what upgrades they need to be useable for our expanding Children's Sunday School. We are considering replacing the parlor carpeting with a more sanitary and lower maintenance flooring.

The next Trustees meeting is Tuesday, January 2.
