PASTOR'S MESSAGE: DRAW CLOSER TO GOD

April ties us to Lenten season, a moment to reflect, renew, and seek God. I want to encourage you in this season to pause and draw closer to God, even during our busy and uncertain world. You may be carrying worries about family, work, or the state of our nation. If so, you are not alone. But through prayer, fasting, and acts of kindness, we are reminded of how God consistently brings hope, healing, and renewals in ways we may not yet see.

Matthew 11:28 states, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." No matter what this journey brings, Christ's love is steady, and His sacrifice reminds us that we are never without grace.

During this year's Lenten pilgrimage, we have been studying on how to practice compassion and be encouraging to those who are difficult to engage with, especially in a time that often feels divided. My hope and prayer is that we take the opportunity to be a reflection of Christ's love through kindness, forgiveness, and generosity by reaching out to a neighbor in need, offering words of encouragement, or simply choosing patience in a difficult moment or conversation.

Paul writes, "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience." (Colossians 3:12) Let us accept this challenge to live Paul's words out, not just during

Lent but in our daily lives so that others may see Christ through our daily practices. The challenge is all about renewal and seeking God in all places.

My pilgrimage is that we would all feel God's peace in a real personal way. Easter is coming to remind us that darkness never has the final word rather light does. As John writes, "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." (John 16:33) So let us walk in faith, encouraging one another and trusting God to make all things new—a new beginning, a new relationship, and a new heart that is filled with compassion. So, let us resurrect into this new life this coming year.

- Selected Weston County Fire Protection District as the beneficiary for the Spring Benefit Luncheon on Friday, April 25. UMW members signed up to bring casseroles. Area churches have been contacted to bring salads and desserts.

TRUSTEES WORK ON PROJECTS


The Board of Trustees met March 3 with six members in attendance. Items of business included:

 The front door has been repaired. (See picture of Jake Shook, Melvin Costa, and Carl Sundstrom repairing the door.)

- The sanctuary thermostat programming has been corrected.
- Miscellaneous duct repairs are in progress.
- The RAN Grant application continues to move forward. Sharon and Carl participated in a Zoom meeting about automated building controls. The system presented is too expensive with too little return for our use, but it has similar advantages to the system proposed by PRHC of Gillette at a significantly lower cost.
- There was considerable discussion concerning moving the Building Fund into the Capital Improvement Fund. The Trustees are seeking the source of the money in the Building Fund.
- The Trustees agreed to pay for a new AV computer and required peripherals with undesignated memorials. The new laptop has been purchased; Sharon is setting it up for our use. Research continues for the selection of the TV's.
- Repairing an air leak in the chancel was discussed. Carl has been monitoring a reported water leak in the storeroom but has not found any water/moisture in the area, even after the recent rapid snow melt.

The next Trustees meeting will be Tuesday, April 1, at 6pm in the Church Parlor.
